

Indian Railways



Indian Railways manages the fourth-largest national railway system by size and with more than 1.2 million employees, it is the world's ninth-largest employer and India's second-largest employer. The history of Indian railways is more than 170 years old with the formal inauguration ceremony being performed on 16th April 1853, when 14 railway carriages carrying about 400 guests left Bori Bunder at 3.30 pm "amidst the loud applause of a vast multitude and to the salute of 21 guns."

For many of us, train journeys were the heartbeat of our childhood adventures. Each trip was a tapestry of laughter and wonder. We would race to claim the coveted window seat, our eyes wide with excitement as the train chugged along. The moment the powerful engine coupled with the carriages was a sight to behold, like a giant metal creature coming to life. The Royal Journey January 26 – First Luxury Train

The Palace on Wheels is India's first luxury tourist train launched by the Indian Railways in joint collaboration with Rajasthan Tourism Development Corporation (RTDC) to promote tourism in Rajasthan. The train was launched in 1982. The concept of the Palace on Wheels was derived from the royal background of the coaches, which were originally meant to be the personal railway coaches of the erstwhile rulers of the princely states of Rajputana, Baroda, the Nizam of Hyderabad and mainly the Governor-General of India. This cocktail captures the rich flavors of Rajasthan and Delhi, reflecting the elegance of the princely past.






The City of Joy February 24 - First Tram

Trams in India were established in the late 19th century. Horse-drawn trams were introduced in Kolkata in 1873 and trams were also introduced in Kanpur later. They were discontinued in all Indian cities between 1933 and 1964, except for Kolkata. The first horse-drawn trams in India ran a 2.4-mile (3.9 km) distance between Sealdah and Armenian Ghat Street on 24 February 1873. This cocktail evokes the vibrant streets of West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh, blending tradition with a modern twist.

THE JEWEL March 01 - First Narrow Gauge

Gaekwar's Baroda State Railway (GBSR) holds a remarkable place in Indian railway history as the first narrow gauge railway line in the country owned by the Princely State of Baroda, which was ruled by the Gaekwar dynasty. The railway track has the distinction of being the first narrow-gauge line to be laid in British India, and also the first railway to be owned by any Princely State of India. In 1862, Maharaja Khanderao Gaekwad, the Maharaja of Baroda, inaugurated 8 miles of railway line from Dabhoi to Miyagam. Initially oxen were used to haul the train. This cocktail brings together the essence of Gujarat, combining unique flavors that reflect the state's spirit.

SULTAN, SINDH AND SAHIB

April 16 – First Passenger Train

On April 16, 1853, the Indian subcontinent saw its first ever passenger train journey. Four hundred lucky guests had signed up for a historic trip from Mumbai's Bori Bunder to Thane in Maharashtra, on a train run by the Great Indian Peninsula Railway. Pulled by steam locomotives—Sultan, Sindh and Sahib—the rail carriages were flagged off with wide applause and a 21-gun salute. Also the first steam operated railway operated in 1837 in Madras. In 1925, the first electric train ran in Bombay on DC traction. The first locomotive manufacturing unit was commissioned in 1950 at Chittaranjan with the first coach manufacturing unit set-up at Madras in 1955. This cocktail represents Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu, capturing the essence of a groundbreaking moment in Indian history.

THE F-734 May 01 – First Indigenously-Built Locomotive

The F-734 is the first ever locomotive to be built completely in India - a milestone in the history of Indian Railways. Manufactured in 1895 by the Ajmer Workshop of the North Western Railway. The F-734 was used on the Rajputana Malwa Railway (also known as Rajputana State Railway before 1882). It ran from Delhi to Indore and upto Ahmedabad, and later on Bombay Baroda & Central India (BB & CI) Railway for mixed (passenger and goods) traffic. This cocktail blends flavors from Rajasthan, Gujarat, and Madhya Pradesh, celebrating India's engineering milestones.

THE QUEEN

June 01 – First Superfast Train, Deccan Queen

Introduced on June 1, 1930, the Deccan Queen was India's "first superfast train, first long-distance electric-hauled train, first vestibuled train, the first train to have a 'women-only' car, and the first train to feature a dining car". The service name comes from the Marathi nickname "दख्बन ची राणी" (Queen of the Deccan), a popular nickname for Pune. Deccan Queen is currently the fastest train service linking Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus and Pune Junction. This cocktail captures the vibrant essence of Mumbai and Pune, reflecting the elegance and speed of this pioneering train.

July 04 – First Mountain Train


Mountain Railways of India refer to three rail lines operated by Indian Railways in hilly terrain. Darjeeling Himalayan Railway, which is also known as the Toy Train, In 1880. The Darjeeling Steam Tramway (later the Darjeeling Himalayan Railway) started its first section between Siliguri and Kurseong. The line was extended to Darjeeling in 1881. The mountain railways were designated as World Heritage Sites in 1999. The Kalka-Shimla Railway, in the Siwalik Hills of Himachal Pradesh started operating in 1903. The Nilgiri Mountain Railway is among the first, and still outstanding, examples of a Hill Passenger Railway.

Opened in 1899, it was extended upto Ooty in 1903. It was a bold and ingenious engineering initiative to establish a rail link across a mountainous terrain of great beauty. This cocktail combines the flavors of West Bengal, Himachal Pradesh, and Tamil Nadu, celebrating the beauty of India's hilly terrains.
